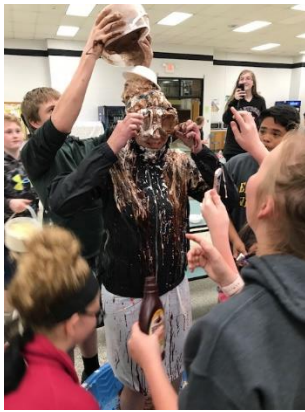
## Value Viking Winners

Ed-Co students Laura Bueno and Josephine Cialfi designed the winning t-shirt and Bo Struble and Cameron Kirby designed the Winning pin.

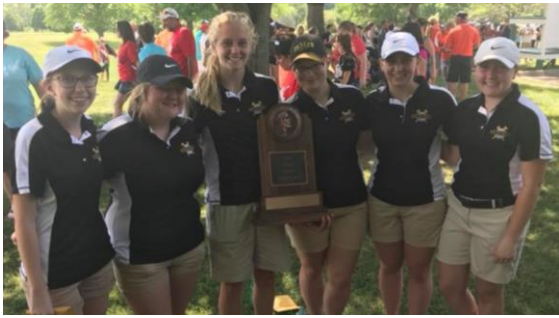
## 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade field trip

A-A-A-A-H-H-H-H-H-H-H!!!! Summer Vacation! For teachers, summer vacation means finally catching up (my desk will look like a desk again), housework (clutter has piled up since Christmas vacation), and a little R & R. For students, summer vacation means more time outside enjoying the great outdoors, participating in summer activities like Little League and county fair, and maybe a little family vacation or day trip.

This summer, I challenge you to incorporate some extra reading into your schedule. One of my fondest memories as a child was finally completing fourth grade to receive the summer reading calendars from my teacher, Mrs. Glanz. She would create a calendar with a different challenge for every day, some related directly to reading, some not so much. Sitting in a dry bathtub to read a book definitely saved the pages from getting wet. We never had a tree that I could climb to sit in to read, so I sat underneath it, enjoying the warm summer breeze. Sometimes I had to enlist the help of neighbors or wait for my mother to come home from work to play a board game after reading the directions. Having a picnic inside on a stormy day was just as good as outside and you didn't have to battle the bugs. Visiting about the book you were reading between bites was a bonus! Just knowing that that next calendar was coming at the end of the month had me anxiously checking the mail as a kid. Sit down with your children and brainstorm ideas for creating your own summer reading calendar. You know what your children like and what your resources are. Write at least a few things down to try over the course of the month, if not every day. Only write for June to start or plan clear ahead through August. Save some open days to repeat preferred activities. Include some "Free Choice" days and let the kids decide on the fly. Maybe they'll hear about something a friend is doing and want to try that as an option.

With today's technology, even more ideas for summer reading are available, like reading a newspaper article online or accessing an e-book. You can probably even Google summer reading ideas to include on your calendar! Old summer staples, like summer reading programs at your local library, are another handy alternative if you like a variety of programs or the convenience of a predetermined



schedule. Any activities your children participate in throughout the summer are opportunities to build background knowledge.

Edgewood has Rodeo Days at the end of June, while Colesburg goes all out for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, now the last Saturday in June. The Iowa State Fair in August is full of possibilities for all interests, especially the edible kind! Research studies have shown time and time again that the more experiences and background knowledge a child has, whether from actively partaking in or simply reading about a chosen topic, the stronger the foundation for greater learning overall and the more connections that can be made to new learning.

As teachers, I know we appreciate when the children come to us with some knowledge about a variety of things so that we can use that as a launching point for areas of additional study. As Former First Lady Hilary Clinton said, "It takes a village to raise a child". Which reminds me – that's on my summer reading list! What's on yours??? Happy reading!!!!!!

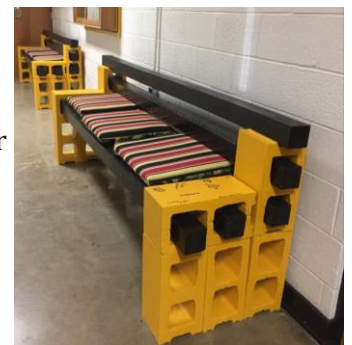
