Our preschool program uses a program called Jolly Phonics to teach letter sounds. This is a wonderful program that uses actions, songs and coloring pages to teach letter sounds. The action adds extra support to children just learning about letter sounds. We learn one letter sound each week.

Use of Recording Device Notice

A parent may view the recordings without consent from any student or parent of a minor student also shown in the recording if the other students are bystanders. But if there is an altercation between multiple students, then all parents must give consent in order for the recordings to be viewed by parents.
