SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS - The PSAT/NMSQT will be offered at Ed-Co on Wednesday, October 19th from 8:30-11:00 am. 10th & 11th grade students will be excused from class during this time. The cost of the test is \$15 (Checks can be made out to Ed-CO) Below are three great reasons to take this test!

1. The PSAT/NMSQT propels students toward college and career readiness. Whether or not you plan to take the SAT or ACT this pre test will be good practice for you to learn the basic format of these types of tests.
2. The test results will let you and the school know which advanced courses you should check out next year.
3. Taking the test makes it easy for colleges and scholarship programs to find you. Millions of dollars are available to help pay for college. Juniors will also be automatically signed up for the National Merit Scholarship Program which is

an academic competition for recognition and scholarships.
