It is almost unbelievable that we have reached the end of the semester! As I look back at my first semester teaching at Ed-Co, I am blown away by the amazing

things students have accomplished.

This semester, we have been focused on projectbased learning and hands-on experiences. The Welding 1 students have been working together to make innovative Christmas tree skeletons for lights that will be displayed outside of Mr. Busch's house during the holiday season. Agricultural Mechanics has had the opportunity to learn about structures, as well as codes and regulations by building a set of stairs for Mr. Calderwood's Addams Family production.

Currently, the mechanics class is completing a woodworking project for the baseball field. In Introduction to Agriculture, students have been working to better understand animal handling through a series of labs and learning more about Dr. Temple Grandin's work. Ag Drawing students were able to showcase their creativity through designing a tiny house using CAD equipment and traditional drafting. These students are currently constructing model bridges using only glue and popsicle sticks; we are having a contest to see which bridge holds the most weight!

As for the spring semester, ag students are looking forward to our annual spring greenhouse sale, using the hydroponics systems and working with small engines.

News from Mrs. Anderson


The goals in the secondary special ed classroom focus on closing the academic and social/emotional gap between a student and their peers. The intensive

interventions typically use reading and math strategies in a small group or one-on-one setting to reteach skills. Student's progress is monitored weekly to guide the instruction. The social/emotional/behavioral interventions include teaching students to develop a growth mindset and understanding of resilience and promoting good time management skills.

For parents wondering how they can help their child at home here are some suggestions: 1) provide a routine for your child and promote organization by setting bedtimes (even at the middle/high school level), have a designated place to set the backpack and a quiet place to do homework, and discuss the week's activity schedule so kids can begin learning to budget their time. 2) promote reading by subscribing to a newspaper or magazine, visit the public library with your child and make sure they have a library card or promote the use of audiobooks, have your child read aloud to you (even if it's just one page or a recipe), establish a 20–30-minute time for no screens when the entire family either reads or plays a gameeveryone needs some quiet time. 3) demonstrate how you use math when comparing costs in the grocery store or when estimating for daily purchases.

At the secondary level, students are taught to selfadvocate for their needs by learning to improve their communications skills with teachers. The students have been instructed in how to email inquiries to their teachers and respectfully ask for clarification.

The secondary English Language Learners have been working to expand their vocabulary, and correct spelling and grammatical errors.

<u>News from Superintendent Busch</u> Edgewood-Colesburg Schools Safe and Proactive With Radon

Did you know that January is Radon Action Month? During January, the Iowa Department of Public Health joins the American Lung Association of Iowa and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in encouraging Iowans to test their homes for radon. Because the safety of students, staff and community is a priority for Edgewood-Colesburg Community School District, we have decided to also test our schools for radon.

What is radon and why does it matter? You can't see, smell or taste it, but radon could be present at dangerous levels if it becomes trapped inside buildings. Radon gas moves upward through cracks and other openings in the foundations of buildings from the soil under a building. In the United States, radon is the leading cause of lung cancer deaths among nonsmokers.

Ed-Co Schools is in the process of testing our junior/senior high school buildings for radon. Because testing can consist of several rounds of information gathering, we are still in the midst of tests. We will share the final results with the public after all tests come back and are analyzed and interpreted.

The State of Iowa only requires 4-year old preschools/Head Start rooms to be tested for radon. We believe ALL of our staff and students should be safe! Ed-Co has proactively placed all of our school buildings on a continuous rotating radon test schedule. In 2017 we tested the whole elementary, so it is time to retest the entire building.

For most students and staff, research suggests that schools are actually the *second* largest contributor to radon exposure. *The home is likely to be the most significant source of radon exposure.* Please test your home for radon and if necessary, take action to reduce the risk of lung cancer by reducing elevated radon concentrations. Rest assured we are doing everything we can on the school side of things to keep our students, staff and community safe.
