We have had a fantastic start of the school year! The 5th and 6th graders have been working really hard in math class. The 5th graders are working on place

value, multiplication, and expressions right now. They are getting ready to take their first test of the year and I think they are ready for it. This group has been learning fast and have caught on to concepts quickly. I'm excited to see how the rest of the year goes for them! The 6th graders are also in the swing of things. They are currently working on whole numbers and decimals. They've also learned about least common multiples and greatest common factors. This group has been a blast to work with so far!

We have begun doing "lead time" on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:30-8:50. This ties in with The Leader in Me program we have been doing the last few years. This lead time focuses on building skills in our students like leadership, responsibility, accountability, problem solving, adaptability, communication, initiative and self-direction, creativity, cross-cultural skills, and teamwork. The intense war in our daily game of SET rages on. As of right now, Mr. Weber's class has the best SET time of the year at 2 minutes and 36 seconds. The all-time record belongs to Mrs. Ramsey's 2018-2019 class with a scorching time of 2 minutes and 33 seconds.

News from Mrs. George



We are off to a great start in the Elementary Art Dept. Because our students change so much over the summer, all grades are focused on creating their self-portrait for display in our building.

We talk about how all artists have created their own self-portrait image in the style of Realism, Impressionism, Cubism, and Surrealism. After hearing the story, Picture Perfect by students at Fletcher Walker Elem. in Westwood, California, the first graders did their first preliminary sketch in their new sketchpads of themselves. Using handheld mirrors, their goal was to draw their face and neck including all of their facial features. We talked about how the word "trait" is in the word "portrait". Our traits are unique to us and that's what makes each of us different and special.

Our second graders are creating a self-portrait image using blue paper and blue jeans. We call this mixed media project "Blue Jean Kids". They will be on display in the atrium. The third graders are learning about "Cubism". Their projects will emulate work done by Pablo Picasso. In fourth grade students are creating an actual size image of their face and shoulders with the style of Realism, using pencil,

marker, and crayon. These images will appear in the foreground of their projects, the background will show their favorite place to be. These portraits will be displayed with the caption, "Future Leaders".

The fifth grade self-portrait images will be of themselves blowing a bubble with their favorite flavor of bubblegum. The eves and cheeks will reflect stress or energy needed to make the bubble. The style will look cartoonish or Surreal. Finally our 6th grade self-portraits will be a 3-D image of themselves from head to toe. This small mixed media project will be used to decorate their tree in the Elem. Tree Festival in December. Inspiration for this project comes from the song, I'll Be Home for Christmas. These projects will emulate puppets from the Victorian Age.

Miss Pasker, our student teacher, and I are excited about the start of the new school year. Following the community building First Eight Days in the general

education classrooms with their peers focusing on the Leader in Me Habits, students have toured the classroom and reviewed expectations in various settings at school. They have also been busy learning new schedules and routines. Miss Pasker and I have been preparing for interventions and progress monitoring, along with ensuring proper accommodations and modifications. We are eager to enjoy another successful school year!

Many students have reading goals based on fluency rates (words correct per minute) on grade level reading passages. Other students have reading goals related to specific word skills, like correctly reading CVC (consonant vowel consonant) words. Similarly, students with math goals typically either have basic computation tests involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division appropriate for their grade

Use of Recording Device Notice

The Edgewood-Colesburg Community School District Board of Directors has authorized the use of recording devices on school premises and district buses. The recording devices will be used to monitor student behavior to maintain order and to promote and maintain a safe environment. Recordings of students in the classroom will also be used to improve educational practices. Students and parents are hereby notified that the content of the recording may be used in a student disciplinary proceeding. The content of the recording are confidential student records and will be retained with other student records. Recordings will only be retained if necessary for use in a student disciplinary proceeding or other matter as determined necessary by the administration. Parents may request to view the recording of their child if the recordings are used in a disciplinary proceeding involving their child. A parent may view the recordings without consent from any student or parent of a minor student also shown in the recording if the other students are bystanders. But if there is an altercation between multiple students, then all parents must give consent in order for the recordings to be viewed by parents.

level or concepts and applications probes, embedding computation into a variety of math skills, again often at grade level. Yet other students have goals related to behaviors displayed at school, promoting social skills and self-efficacy necessary for a successful school career and life beyond the school's walls. Regardless of their goals, all students are working hard to practice these activities daily with a growth mindset and graphing their progress monitoring scores every other week, following their IEP progress monitoring testing.

Hard to believe more than one month of the 2019-20 school year has passed. If you are interested in helping out at school, we are always in search of people that would like to be mentors for

kids and we are specifically looking for community members that people that can assist kids at the elementary with reading skills. Please contact one of the offices if you are interested in any of these roles.

Please remember that the best way to be notified of school early outs or a school cancellation is by signing up for text notification. It is also sent out to some of the local radio and TV stations, so please stay aware of those school alerts. You are able to receive a text on your phone for school changes if you so desire. Check out the district website for more information.

Buses leave the elementary at approximately 3:18; students who walk home or get picked up by parents are dismissed after that time. Please make sure your child knows what they are doing each day by sending a note to school if they are doing something different than their normal routine. If there are emergency changes, please notify the office by 2:15. Ed-Co Elementary is a school-wide Title I school allowing for Title I teachers to work with all elementary students. All teachers at Ed-Co Elementary meet the highly qualified requirements under the Title 1 guidelines. The teachers in our elementary have earned either a Bachelor's degree or a Master's degree in elementary education.

One of the things that teachers will focus on throughout this year is learning about appropriate interventions for students that are having difficulty learning new skills and/or concepts. This is called a Multi-Tiered System of Supports, where teachers find different ways to help students learn. This is not really a new concept; just something that teacher learning will focus on this year.

If you have concerns or questions about your child's school performance, please contact the school staff involved. We are here to provide the best learning environment possible. Thank you for allowing us to educate your children this year. As always, I ask that you please become involved with the educational opportunities for our young people and assist us in making Edgewood-Colesburg the best school in the State of Iowa. Summer Improvements 2019 Edition

Very similar to last summer there were many additional projects along with the usual summer deep cleaning that were or soon will be completed. Some of the projects are not noticeable from the outside.

At the Elementary building there is new paint, and

new flooring on the ramp to the gym, as well as a new parking lot currently being installed to the south of the school.



At the high school, the gym floor

has been refinished, painting and new trophy display case by the entry of the gym, and the parking lot has been expanded significantly.





Handicapped accessible bleachers were installed at the baseball field and are being installed at the

track/football field. The most involved project of the summer which most people will not notice are the HVAC and electrical upgrades at the secondary building.



Currently the district is working with IIW, an architectural firm based in Dubuque, to design and bid out safety and security projects which will secure entrances at both buildings. The intent is to have those projects finished by the start of the 2020-21 school year.

Where is the new elementary playground? Last spring, a new piece of equipment was purchased to replace the main existing one. A grant was applied for but was not received for a few smaller pieces. The current soft tiles around and under the equipment needs to be replaced. This is a considerable expense, even more than the playground equipment itself.

These projects are funded by the voted Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) and the State Penny for School Infrastructure also referred to as SAVE.

Thanks for supporting the vote to approve the PPEL and contacting legislators to extend SAVE. These funds will make additional improvements possible.
