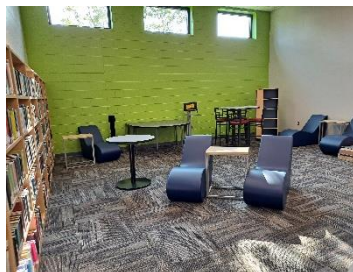
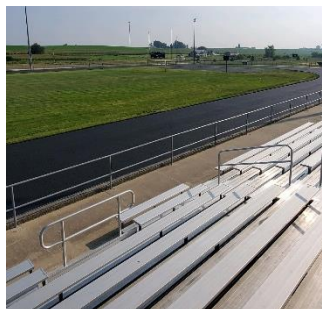
Along with the usual summer deep cleaning, concrete work, and tuckpointing; other projects were also completed or soon will be in the near future. Some of the projects are not noticeable from the outside of the building but will brighten up the inside. A big “thank you” goes out to the custodial staff for completing these projects or assisting the contractors in getting them done.

One of the big upgrades was the remodel of the JR/SR high library/media center. Windows were added; shelving and seating were replaced. The elementary library/media center also received soft seating. In our outside areas, the elementary parking lot was blacktopped, the football field was recrowned, and the track was resurfaced.

The Board has been working with Demmer Architecture, Emmergent Architecture, and the Donovan Group. The architects and consultant worked with staff and community groups to identify facilities needs. Similar needs that were identified from the focus groups in 2016 resurfaced: HVAC/mechanical upgrades in the elementary school, building of a new competition gym, new space for career and technical education, and upgrades to safety and security, including improvements to traffic flow and drop-off/pick-up areas. Look for updates soon.

If you have not seen last summer’s projects at the elementary (new playground and lockers), make sure you check them out. The students really enjoy the new atmosphere.

These projects are funded by the voted Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) and the State Penny for School Infrastructure also referred to as SAVE. Thanks for supporting the vote to approve the PPEL and contacting legislators to extend SAVE. These funds will make additional improvements possible.

Mrs. Kayla Lawrence



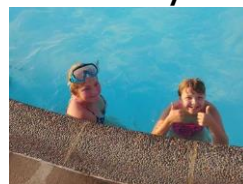

The beginning of the school year is so fun and exciting! Currently, 19 students are enrolled in my classroom. In my classroom we use the Project Approach. Activities and themes are student-driven,

which means we learn about things the children are interested in. We usually begin the year learning all about names. Children love to do activities with their names and it is great exposure to letter names and letter sounds.

Along with the projects, we also learn about seasons, holidays and basic preschool skills, such as letter names and sounds, number names, counting, writing and social skills. This learning is done through play, games and various activities.

Our preschool program uses a program called Jolly Phonics to teach letter sounds. This is a wonderful program that uses actions, songs and coloring pages to teach letter sounds. The action adds extra support to children just learning about letter sounds. We learn one letter sound each week.

Our handwriting program is called Handwriting Without Tears. This is a very appropriate, hands-on curriculum that promotes fine motor skills. The preschoolers love to make letters and shapes with the wooden manipulatives included in this program.

Our overall curriculum is the Creative Curriculum. This curriculum allows children to learn through play. There are 36 objectives, which are covered and assessed throughout the school year. I can't say this for anyone reading this, but I know I'm ready to be back! There's something about the beginning of a school year that brings so much excitement! I'm ready to see all of my wonderful students, watch them grow in academics and as leaders, and to begin learning right along with them!

As stated above, I love watching my students grow and as a Special Education Teacher, that is my ultimate goal. Have you ever wondered what Special Education Teachers do and what Special Education is? Unlike other teachers who focus primarily on academics, the special education teacher serves both as an educator and as an advocate for students with special needs. His or her schedule is divided among planning, instruction, assessing students and managing their individualized education programs

(IEPs). The job includes scheduling, attending and following up after IEP meetings, writing IEPs with attainable and measurable goals, tracking and reporting student progress on IEP goals, providing guidance to general education teachers who wish to accommodate students, administering assessments, planning and instructing for individual students, managing and evaluating instructional assistants and other paraprofessionals, developing behavior management plans and more.

Special Education teachers can also teach Alternate Assessment if they have the required endorsement. DLM (Dynamic Learning Maps) alternate assessments are for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities whose academic performance is judged against alternate achievement standards. Content areas include English Language Arts, Math, and Science. Students who participate in Iowa's Alternate Assessments will not participate in Iowa Assessments. Students are eligible to be on Alternate Assessment if: The student has a significant cognitive disability, receives instruction on the Iowa Core Essential Elements which are aligned to the Iowa Core Standards but are of reduced breadth, depth, and complexity, and requires extensive direct individualized instruction and substantial supports to achieve measureable gains in the grade-and age appropriate curriculum. News from Mrs. Trenkamp Welcome back to another great year of learning! The start of the school year is always a moment of great anticipation and excitement. For everyone, students, parents, and teachers alike, there is that

wonderful sense of a new beginning and a fresh start. It is natural for students to have a bit of anxiety and maybe even a few questions – what will my teacher(s) be like, who will be in my class, etc. But the focus should always be on the new upcoming adventure of learning and growing. To make it all go smoothly, there are a number of things that we can as parents do to make this educational experience be as positive, productive, and worthwhile as possible. A key responsibility of ours as parents is to help our children embrace this moment and prepare them to get the most out of it as possible.

What can you do? First and foremost, help create a climate of positive anticipation. If possible, take time before school even begins to visit the school. See the grounds at a very non-threatening time. Walk the halls if this will be a new school and begin to make everything from driving to the school, walking in the front door, to being at the building very familiar. This will be “their” school and we all want them to feel a pride and passion in being there. Share the joy in seeing them be there and all that they will be learning. For your child, encourage that sense of “can’t wait to get to school.”

When school begins, take the time to engage in the school. Meet the teachers and the school leaders. Introduce yourself. Appreciate the fact that they want to partner with you in helping to nurture and support your children. Believe me when I say that the great teachers we have in our schools can’t wait to work with your child (ren). Great schools always come back to the relationship between the child, the teacher, and the parents. Find ways to engage yourself in school life. Make the educational experience at your school “a way of life,” not just the place where you “send” your children. Make it something special that you all share and benefit from together. Trust these great educators and value all that they will be doing for your child.

Summer schedules can be quite different than throughout the school term. Many of our students tend to shift their bedtimes back a few hours during these relaxing months. Sleep is very important to each child’s health and education. The American

Academy of Pediatrics (AAP, 2016) issued a Statement of Endorsement supporting the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) guidelines outlining recommended sleep duration for children from infants to teens. The group recommends the following:

- Children 3 to 5 years of age should sleep 10 to 13 hours per 24 hours on a regular basis to promote optimal health.

- Children 6 to 12 years of age should sleep 9 to 12 hours per 24 hours on a regular basis to promote optimal health.

The group found that adequate sleep duration for age on a regular basis leads to improved attention, behavior, learning, memory, emotional regulation, quality of life, and mental and physical health. Not getting enough sleep each night is also associated with an increase in other medical concerns. In addition to these recommendations, the AAP suggests that all screens be turned off 30 minutes before bedtime and that TV, computers and other screens not be allowed in children’s bedrooms. For young children, establishing a bedtime routine is important to ensuring children get adequate sleep each night. This is a summary of the statement from AAP, you can find the entire article here:

We encourage you to consider these guidelines as you begin shifting bedtime back into the school routine. Together we can partner to ensure all students are well rested and ready to learn! And above all else, cherish these years for and with your child. Never lose sight of the fact that time moves quickly and the growth that you will see on a daily basis will seem to flash by you in no time. Appreciate the fact that never in their lives have they had so many adults looking out for their best interests. Home and school together make a tremendous partnership and the beneficiary of all of that love and care, challenge and support, nurturing and mentoring, is ultimately your child. Helping our children get a strong and vibrant education is a gift – a priceless gift that will last a lifetime.

Welcome to the 2021-22 school year!
The start of school means the end of summer and the start of fall. Our school

Students and the mentoring program are still in need of mentors. In as little as 4 to 5 hours a week, you can have a great effect on the future. Visit www.helpingservices.org/mentoring to download an application to start the process.
